PE and Sport Premium: Impact Report July 2026

Rationale:

As part of the school's acceptance of the school Sport Premium (SP) there is a statutory responsibility to evaluate the way we have employed this funding to enable the development of PE and physical activity in the school. This report provides governors and the school community with a detailed summary of the school's use of this funding. This report also forms the basis of the school's annual reporting of the SP for 2025-2026

How St Joseph's Catholic Primary School Has used the PE&SP to have a measurable impact on pupils' PE attainment, physical activity and sport participation:

St Joseph's Catholic Primary school has an inclusive philosophy that promotes provision for all, regardless of background or ability. Staff are aware of vulnerable pupils and through core activities will look for ways to enable participation for all pupils.

To support us in meeting the universal needs of all pupils we have used the PE&SP to ensure we have a solid core offer in PE, School Sport and Physical Activity.

Core Offer:

- All children have access to the PE national curriculum and teachers are supported in the delivery of PE through the PE Hub SoW. This programme provides teachers with progressive planning that is matched to broad year groups. Additional material is available to support teachers deliver PE for SEND or physical challenges.
- PE Hub planning supports teachers in delivering fundamental physical skills linked to traditional games and activities and through this develop children's ability to: throw, catch, run, jump, land, balance, change direction, kick, and strike.
- CPD and demonstration clips and documents are available throughout the Scheme of Work.

Participation in Competitive Sport and Sporting Festivals

The school has continued to actively participate in the local School Sports Partnership programme and a wide range of sporting festivals, tournaments and enrichment opportunities throughout the academic year. Due to the size of the school and individual cohorts, almost all pupils have had the opportunity to represent the school or participate in external sporting activities appropriate to their age and stage of development.

During the year, pupils attended a **Year 3/4 Gymnastics Festival**, where they experienced specialist apparatus including balance beams, parallel bars, vaulting equipment and trampolines. The event focused on participation, enjoyment and personal challenge, helping children to develop confidence, resilience and a willingness to try new activities. Feedback from organisers highlighted the pupils' excellent attitude and enthusiasm throughout.

The school was also represented at the **Biggest Ever Girls' Football Festival**, where pupils from Years 3, 4 and 5 participated in football skills sessions, mini matches and team-building activities. This event provided a valuable opportunity to celebrate girls' participation in sport, promote confidence in football and support wider engagement in physical activity.

Children from Years 3 and 4 attended an **Introduction to Netball Festival** in partnership with England Netball and Westonbirt School. Pupils participated in a range of skill-development stations and mini matches, enabling them to apply their learning in a fun and supportive environment while developing teamwork and communication skills.

The school entered both girls' and boys' teams into local **Year 3/4 Football Tournaments**. Pupils demonstrated excellent teamwork, determination and sportsmanship whilst competing against local schools. Individual pupils were recognised by organisers for their effort, attitude and commitment to the school's sporting values.

Similarly, **Year 5/6 girls' and boys' football teams** represented the school in local tournaments. Pupils showed resilience, teamwork and perseverance throughout challenging matches and were praised by organisers for their attitude, commitment and conduct.

In addition to inter-school competition, the school successfully participated in the **TCS Mini London Marathon in Schools**, with all pupils taking part. This whole-school event promoted the importance of regular physical activity and personal challenge, ensuring that every child was involved regardless of sporting ability. The school's participation attracted positive local media coverage and helped raise the profile of physical activity within the wider community.

The school also participated in the **Shine Cricket Programme**, with every pupil across the school taking part in age-appropriate cricket activities. This enabled all children to develop fundamental movement skills, hand-eye coordination, teamwork and an understanding of cricket through inclusive and engaging sessions delivered as part of the curriculum and enrichment offer.

Pupil feedback regarding participation in sporting events remains highly positive. These opportunities continue to support children's physical development, wellbeing, confidence, teamwork and enjoyment of sport whilst reinforcing the school's commitment to providing inclusive sporting experiences for all pupils.

Percentage of pupils in Year 6 who have met the national curriculum requirement to:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m: 92%
- Use a range of strokes effectively: 92%
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations: 92%
